## BE PART OF THE CHANGE

The current climate emergency requires immediate and drastic action. The IPCC 1.5°C Special Report clearly states that global climate neutrality has to be reached by 2050 to avoid irreversible effects and that a collective effort from all sectors of economy and society is needed.

To mainstream key competences on climate action among current and future professionals in the field of development cooperation and humanitarian aid, (e)mission (im)possible offers a MOOC - Massive Open Online Course - a short online training path tailored for the sector, organised in 3 main clusters:

- Climate change basics: climate science and international governance
- The human dimension of climate change: liabilities, climate justice and human rights
- Organisations' actions to curb their emission and to improve their climate action

Development cooperation and the humanitarian aid sector has a great potential in promoting climate actions' mainstreaming at organisation level, community level and institutional level across countries.

To support structural change toward climate action within organisations and to build their capacity to promote change among external stakeholders throughout their action, (e)mission (im)possible will develop, test and disseminate a training scheme and toolkit for the in-depth training "on the job" of sector's professionals. The path will lead organisations to identify strategic aspects of their carbon footprint and develop strategy plans to reduce their emissions while enhancing their climate positive actions.
